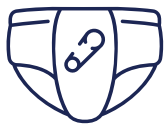

**60** Percentage of families who needed diapers **at least monthly** but did not have them.



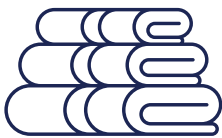
**68** Percentage of families who said receiving a supplemental supply of diapers **"helped us a lot."**



**28** Percentage of families who said **children wore diapers longer than usual** when they did not have enough diapers.



**62** Percentage of parents who **felt happier** as a result of receiving diapers for their children.



**24** Percentage of families who said **children wore a towel or cloth** when they did not have enough diapers.



**61** Percentage of parents who reported that they could **spend money on other needs** as a result of receiving diapers for their children.



**15** Percentage of families who said children experienced **more diaper rashes** when they did not have enough diapers.



**15** Percentage of parents who reported that they could **attend work or school** as a result of receiving diapers for their children.
